Cathedral, Carol C	<ul> <li>The Feasibility Study for the College of The Holy Spirit available early September. It contains proposals in two phases. The first is to establish a potential income steam and the second is proposals for future business developments.</li> <li>The first phase has the potential to provide a rental income from the North College, the clearance of the lower fields into meadow grass, and to make way for ecoburials adjacent to the St Andrew's Cemetery with an area set aside next to this for growing lavender which has the potential to be annually harvested for commercial use A new entrance driveway with car parking is planned from College Street which will be fully compliant with North Ayrshire road safety.</li> <li>Once the final document and plans are in place there will be a public meeting with John Renshaw Architects and Glic Associates. The second phase has proposals which will be clearer once this architect's work is completed and includes a 'market garden' area on the higher field creating potential employment and being leased will provide a possible further regular commercial income.</li> <li>It is intended to hold two meetings, one in the College library and the other in the</li> </ul>
Field Studies Council, Duncan F	<ul> <li>Garrison. Presentation at next month's CCC meeting.</li> <li>We have had a very busy July &amp; August at the centre.</li> <li>Over the summer we have had a mixture of schools, Universities and religious groups enjoying the glorious summer weather!!</li> <li>Over nearly 650 visitors from 4 different religions joined us: 2 visits from the Bahia Council, Quakers from the Northern friend's group &amp; the Family Fellowship group enjoying music, dance and prayer with all groups wanting to rebook for next year.</li> <li>Over 240 students from Durham, Southampton &amp; Glasgow Universities and schools: Morrisons Academy, Maidstone Grammer, Coylton High School visited the centre and conducted their studies on RV Actinia and shore locations round the island.</li> <li>The centre continues to improve with renovation work completed to Keppel house, with the Coastguard housed in one side and our diving/snorkelling unit on the other.</li> <li>The Robertson Museum has been renovated and changed into a classroom/meeting space with the Aquarium next to it, increasing our teaching capacity to 7 classrooms</li> <li>The artifacts from the Robertson collection from the museum have been put into storage awaiting relocation.</li> </ul>
Ferry Users Group Angus C	<ul> <li>Loch Shira: Ramp Repairs delayed from June until early August. The Ferry Committee had asked the Cabinet Secretary for Transport for an independent review into the failure of the Loch Shira ramp – refused. Since the Loch Shira's return to service the vessel has operated reliably.</li> <li>Alternative Ferry Capacity: various vessels have operated the route since February incl the MV Isle of Cumbrae, MV Loch Fyne and the MV Loch Tarbert. All have suffered ramp issues possibly linked to the high volume of commercial traffic for the flood defences.</li> <li>Winter Timetable changes refused by Calmac citing "crew fatigue management".</li> <li>Business Concerns: meeting with business owners and Calmac w/c 2 September to reflect concerns about getting goods and people on and off the island.</li> <li>Contingency Planning: request for a more formal review of Calmac's contingency planning, particularly over the winter timetable to avoid risk of stranding large numbers of people for a long period during a breakdown.</li> <li>Season Tickets: although we have had negative feedback from the Transport Minster, we have confirmed that the figures underpinning the decision are flawed. We are working with Calmac to reconsider this proposal.</li> <li>Islands Connectivity Plan: we fed a number of improved key outcomes points into Transport Scotland's Strategic "Island Connectivity Plan" in early May</li> <li>We are making slow progress with Calmac and Transport Minister regarding the other ticketing issues that have yet to be resolved. These include five main issues: restoration of discounted season tickets, multi journey tickets for SPT ticket holders, multi journey tickets for teenagers, making ticket validity a rolling 6 month validity rather than fixed dates, and going back to "Return Only" tickets from Largs to avoid the need for a large population of staff on Cumbrae.</li> </ul>
