Solar Farm Application

A big THANK YOU to everyone who took the time to voice their views on the solar farm.

The application resulted in 350 written comments, a huge number for our small island. 98% were objections. The majority of people made clear they don't object to solar power on the island, but they do object to this proposal which would result in destruction of a local beauty spot and important habitat, with a private development which doesn't benefit the community.



The proposal received extensive press coverage:

- 2 news broadcasts on TV
- 10 pieces of print media (Scotsman, Herald, Daily Record, Daily Mail, Largs and Millport News)
- 24 digital news pieces
- pieces on radio

What's next?

At the planning committee meeting on 24 May, Dr Gregor Harvie and Councillor Tom Marshall (representing the view of the four ward councillors permitted to comment) presented evidence supporting the comments made by the community of Cumbrae. The Planning Committee was unanimous in rejecting the application, with deputy chair Councillor Timothy Billings highlighting the special nature of Scotland's islands as places large numbers of people visit because of their natural spaces and spectacular views.



1. The applicant has the right to appeal within three months from 9 June 2023 when the decision notice was lodged.

2. If an appeal is lodged, interested parties (including anyone who submitted comments on the original application) will be contacted and given two weeks to submit evidence.

3. If an appeal is lodged, CCC will advise on how to respond. New information isn't allowed, and it's not necessary to repeat comments already made.



Millport Support Group

CCDC Funding Success

Cumbrae Community Development Company (CCDC) have been working for the last two years to secure funding for much needed building repairs required to our stunning Garrison House, the island's Community Hub in the heart of the town. We were ecstatic to be awarded £730,998 through our application, with North Ayrshire Council, to the Islands Programme fund in May 2023. Additional match funding has been secured through Kelburn Windfarm Trust and the Greening Communities Assets Fund.

The Garrison House Regeneration Scheme will restore, re-purpose and enhance the Garrison House complex, a significant asset to the island and an important hub for both residents and visitors alike. The project will secure the building fabric for future generations, improve accessibility, improve the availability of and access to services and increase its energy efficiency and resilience to climate change. Work will include a comprehensive conservation scheme, a new gym accessible to all and a 'changing places' facility.



We now have Loom with a View in one of our Garrison Courtyard Units, enhancing what is already on offer through Cumbrae Crafts, Studio64 Alan Cawley Photography and Garrison House Café & Courtyard.

CCDC will be working this year with NAC on the Pit Stops Project for Cumbrae with £540,000 of funding shared with Arran, for improvements to public toilet blocks and facilities offered.

Our West Lodge Business Centre is thriving and is now home to not only our local Community Radio Station but also Energise Therapies & Training and Think Zap. Both are island businesses, allowing CCDC to support growth and opportunity on Cumbrae.

Garrison Motorhome Site continues to be extremely popular, helping to generate income for businesses on Cumbrae, allowing CCDC to continue supporting our island economy.

CCDC continues to make improvements to their Millport Holiday Apartments this year, investing in more energy efficient water heaters and the installation of Wi-Fi, for the benefit of our clients.

CCDC thank their members and the community for their continued support and invite anyone interested in joining one of our Boards to call into our office within Garrison House for a chat to learn more.

CalMac improved(!) ticketing

The Ferry User's Group (FUG) provides a community view to the Ferry Owners and Operators, CMAL and Calmac, with



representatives of community groups (Community Council, Commuters, NHS, Business Owners, FSC, Cumbrae Forum, Millport Motors, agriculture) working to try to improve the service for islanders.

The new ticketing system, including a new requirement for tickets each way, has been introduced and continues to cause problems despite many of the issues being anticipated and highlighted to CalMac by FUG and islanders during consultations. The FUG committee continues to challenge Calmac and the Transport Minister over the discriminatory way it was introduced onto Cumbrae. We have been promised a meeting with Calmac's senior management for them to explain their plan to improve the system.

Some key points and learnings about the new system:

- Old tickets are valid until the end of June, even those singles dated May, but you will need to exchange them for new ones at either Largs or Cumbrae prior to travel
- It is possible to buy tickets (single from Cumbrae only) by card or cash at Cumbrae Slip, although there have been technology issues which have restricted some sales recently. Calmac claim to be working to fix this.
- If you are setting up an online account, the form seems to only work properly if you fill all boxes in manually (don't use autofill), make sure the postcode identifies your correct address and that you select the +44 (UK) dropdown for your mobile number
- 10 journey tickets for adults can be bought online, but if you do want to continue to buy them over the counter at the Largs Office, it is a convoluted slow process involving an individual transaction for each return journey
- Online individual tickets can be bought for SPT concession users, and there is a process to buy up to 7 "multi journey" concession tickets. Paper copies of this process are available at Pots & Pets or the Forum Shop, however it is not simple (20 steps)
- Car tickets must now include a driver. It's possible to buy a car & concession driver online, just make sure you first remove the default adult passenger on the booking form and select 'more' to view the other options. Similarly for Blue Badge car tickets

Other FUG work

We are awaiting feedback from (yet another) Transport Minister about the restoration of discounted season tickets.

We are also expecting to contribute to a more strategic view of Island Ferry services and Island Connectivity for Cumbrae with Transport Scotland and North Ayrshire Council this summer. We have asked that they consider developing their plans around these desired outcomes for Cumbrae:

- Less ferry disruption on windy (but not extreme stormy) days
- Improve the resilience of Cumbrae to a single point of failure in the transport network
- · Reverse depopulation trends
- Reduce the carbon footprint of Cumbrae
- Encourage more visitors to Cumbrae, but with fewer cars
- Improve the visitor experience to encourage and grow active travel
- Ensure Islanders can get access to the ferry as required
- Ensure that ferry travel pricing for islanders isn't increased



Cumbrae Slip Consultation

There will be a public consultation on 28th June about CMAL's plan to rebuild Cumbrae Slip on its existing location with work starting in 2024 and completing in 2025. The Ferry User's Group have raised the following concerns about the proposals:

- There is no improvement in weather resilience in the design of Cumbrae Slip, which the committee feel is unacceptable given the increase in windy days due to global warming.
- The plan for a temporary (narrower) slipway risks high disruption over the winter period, potentially compromising schooling, NHS services and daily provisions onto the island.
- The traffic management plans during construction risk gridlocking the ferry and bus turning area on busy summer days.

We have proposed an offline build with weather protection, (suggested protection for southerly winds or seas) and adequate off-road vehicle marshalling for 2 ferry loads of cars (50), and passenger welfare for at least a bus load of passengers (70).

Carbon Neutral Islands

The Carbon Neutral Islands (CNI) Project on Cumbrae continues to make progress towards its 2040 net-zero goals as part of the CNI project, but importantly, also improving the way we live, work and sustain our island community.

The Cumbrae Community Climate Action Plan has recently been published (available at <u>carbonneutralcumbrae.co.uk</u>), and we welcomed the Cabinet Secretary for Rural Affairs, Land Reform and Islands, Mairi Gougeon to Garrison House recently as part of the launch of the action plans for each of the 6 project islands (Cumbrae, Barra, Hoy, Islay, Raasay and Yell). CCDC are the anchor organisation for Cumbrae.



Domestic energy efficiency continues to be an area in need of improvement on Cumbrae, and CNI is helping to deliver several key programmes to help households locally including the Area Based and ECO4 Flex schemes, both through North Ayrshire Council. Information on these is available from Scott Watson at Garrison House.

In the coming months, Community Energy Scotland will work with us on various feasibility studies around community owned energy generation, as well as ground-truthing the carbon audits completed earlier this year. Various funded initiatives to improve the energy consumption of domestic properties, such as in-home energy monitors and lowering the carbon footprint of our local businesses, are under way.
